

Gallery Review

The Gordon Huether Studio, located at 1821 Monticello Road, Napa, California, is a smallish gallery housed in an old building that was once a hay barn. The visitor is first greeted by a memorable sight: a huge sculpture of a yellow hand holding a small ball. Some other large installations by the owner/artist dot the premises. It also houses a revolving exhibit of artist Huether's fine art as well as the work of guest artists.

Huether, a German American artist, creates large installations. His style is eclectic, and many of his works are assemblages of a wide variety of objects - scrap metal, old photographs, toys, vintage buttons, and jewelry. One arresting work: a series of four large bull's heads (yes, you read that right - real bull's heads). One head is painted gold, another is decorated by a mosaic of glass pieces. One is festooned with masses of rhinestones, and the last, most colorful, has vintage decorative buttons glued on it, thus creating a real "bling factor", a gaudy, fun work. Another item includes a table and four chairs, all painted a muddy black and wrapped in barbed wire. This item was not designed for comfort!

One work, called "Orange Grid Series" is a series of medium-sized squares, made of textured orange bits of found metal. The separate pieces can be assembled in any order and seem designed for a large viewing space such as a public building or an office.

Huether works mostly with found objects - there is very little traditional brush painting in his gallery, his work is overwhelmingly sculptural and three dimensional. He also works with glass. One item stands out - a medium-sized tray made of iridescent glass straws, fused together in a lattice pattern, it is both functional and pleasing to look at.

One room is filled with photos of the artist's larger works, mostly sculptural pieces and installations, obviously designed for public spaces. One cartoonish, cute item is styled like a huge bug (*or a spider*) with eight legs. Its body is decorated with multicolored vintage buttons. Creeping up a wall, the work can relieve the absolute monotony of a public building.

A few items fall short - a sizable collection of assemblages (*made of toys, jewelry, and old photographs*) does not say much to this viewer. These items seem to be random collections of objects, with no particular theme or aesthetic to tie them together in a coherent composition or narrative. Dolls, toys, and buttons are fun to look at, but these works did not tell me much of a story.
