



Gallery Review

The Crocker Art Museum

Located at 216 "O" St., in downtown Sacramento, the Crocker is one of the largest and finest art museums in Northern California. The Crocker also yields up a few surprises: a great collection of glass art, including a fine piece by Toots Zynsky - this vessel is crafted in the "filet de verre" or glass thread technique that the Artist is known for. She hand pulls the multi-colored threads, but also uses a machine that heats rods of glass into strands, then fuses the threads, squeezing when hot to create a sinuous, abstracted multicolored form.

The Works on Paper section has some standouts: Fabric of Our Lives, is a photo polymer intaglio print of a black and white image of a child's dress, with some small white figures on it.

Black Venus Birth is an imposing ceramic by Anthony Maki Gill. It is large, white with a bold black splattered design. More beautiful glass - Moon Jellyfish Seascape by Richard Satava, clear with the jellyfish shape embedded in the glass. Then there's California Cactus by Hannah and Alana Nicholson van Altena. Made of hot sculpted glass, it is a glowing, abstracted vivid blue work with bright orange flowers.

So much to see - so little time. Some other works include very intricate acrylic compositions, like *Untitled* by Gary Szymanski.

Some unusual materials - a scanned image and then an intricate ink pattern rendered on a wood panel, called *On the Money* by Mark Steven Greenfield. By Camille VandenBerge, an imposing piece, called *Mussel Maiden*, is a subtle ceramic finished off in muted green shades. Her signature style is an elongated human shape, rendered in very subtle colors.

And - there is a solid collection of Roman and Egyptian glass. The Crocker also has a massive collection of antique European ceramics, African, Native American and Oceanic art and very modern clay work. Much too much art to cover in one visit (*or one review*). A little like trying to do the Metropolitan in a couple of hours. Stroll through and try and take in what you can.
